

FINANCIAL AID

All international students who apply for financial aid will be considered for the appropriate international scholarships based on need and availability of funding. We have limited funds for international scholarships; however, the following scholarship opportunities are available:

• Up to six full scholarships covering Carleton's comprehensive fee, including tuition, room and board.

• Up to six partial scholarships with a maximum value of one-half of Carleton's comprehensive fee.

International students applying for financial aid need to complete the Certification of Finances and either the CSS Profile Form or the International Student Financial Aid Application.

Students should indicate their intent to apply for assistance when they submit the Common Application for admissions.
