Wesleyan University is a private, nonsectarian, coeducational liberal arts university located in Middletown, Connecticut (pop. 47,000), that offers all the advantages and benefits of a relatively small school along with facilities, faculty, and research opportunities typically found only at larger universities. Established in 1831 and widely considered one of the premier colleges in the United States, Wesleyan has a long tradition of sustaining a remarkably diverse and lively community of learning.

With 45 majors, 17 minors, 12 certificates, and a variety of distinctive programs, Wesleyan is dedicated to providing a rigorous liberal arts education that values putting ideas into practice. Highly motivated and organized students can complete Wesleyan's four-year bachelor's degree program in six semesters (three years of standard course loads plus summer courses), saving about 20 percent of the total cost of a Wesleyan education.

Wesleyan is among the most selective institutions in the United States: More than 80 percent of its students were chosen from the top tenth of their secondary school classes. Of approximately 3,000 undergraduates, roughly 50 percent are male and 50 percent female, with a full-time graduate enrollment of about 150 in MA and PhD programs in music, mathematics, and the sciences.

Wesleyan University is two hours by car from New York City and Boston, 30 minutes from New Haven, and 20 minutes from Hartford.

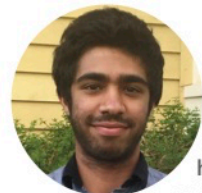

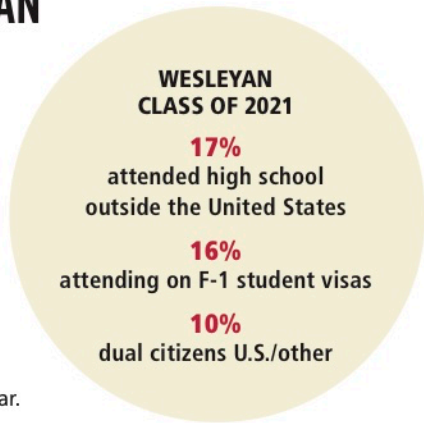
APPLYING TO WESLEYAN

All applicants should complete the Common or Coalition Application to apply to Wesleyan. Preference is not given to either application, and there is no separate application for international students. Students living outside of the United States whose first language is not English will be asked to write an additional 250-word supplemental essay.

Regardless of citizenship, applicants attending schools outside the United States and Canada are not required to submit SAT or ACT results if actual and/or predicted results for national, standardized, subject-based, or International Baccalaureate examinations are submitted. Applicants in the People's Republic of China, where the SAT is not available, are exempt from this requirement, as are students in high schools outside of the United States and Canada that follow an American curriculum. If a student in high school outside the United States and Canada cannot present any of the above external exams and is not enrolled in an American curriculum, then they will be required to submit SAT or ACT test results and two SAT Subject Tests. The test-optional policy does not apply to tests of English proficiency. Students for whom English is not their first language are required to submit testing that demonstrates adequate proof of English proficiency. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AT WESLEYAN

- Wesleyan's international population is as diverse as the rest of its student body. More than 50 countries are represented at Wesleyan, with members of the Class of 2021 coming from more than 40 countries, including Angola, Brazil, Denmark, Honduras, Indonesia, Jordan, Moldova, China, New Zealand, and Singapore.
- Since 1995, the Freeman Asian Scholars Program has provided four-year full-tuition scholarships for outstanding students from the People's Republic of China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam to earn a bachelor's degree at Wesleyan. Almost 300 students apply for the 11 available scholarships each year.



CAREER OUTCOMES AT WESLEYAN

- Some of the top employers of Wesleyan graduates are Citigroup, Google, Kaiser Permanente, the U.S. Department of State, and Amazon. Of the Class of 2016, approximately 22 percent work in finance and consulting, 13 percent in education, 15 percent in STEM fields, 6 percent in nonprofits, 24 percent in communications and entertainment, and 6 percent in health-related fields.
- The top graduate schools for members of the Class of 2016 were University of California Berkeley School of Law, Brown University, University of Chicago, Columbia University, Northwestern University, and Yale University School of Medicine.
- Of the Class of 2016, more than 85 percent of the graduates were employed or in graduate school six months after graduation.
